  - Additional funding needed
  - Docket is not opened yet any day now
  - Law firm, Schlack Ito, is ready to engage but more funding is needed before DWEA can commit
- NY ACE NY
  - o PUC petition on RPS
    - 1. Improvements on how to better use funds
    - 2. Remove per project funding cap
    - 3. Does not effect small wind funds
    - 4. NOTE: RPS does not expire until 2015
  - Streamline interconnect requirements
  - How can current RPS program be changed to better utilize potential for DW program?
  - Clean up bill net-metering implementation & consistency
  - Streamline permitting Article 10 for large systems
    - 1. May have opportunity outside of legislation
- 4. Regional Partner updates:
  - IA IWEA, Harold Prior
    - i. Most aggressive DW agenda to date
    - ii. 11/9 mtg coordinating lobbying efforts including solar and other renewables
    - iii. Met with Gov's office He is supportive
    - iv. Legislative fix for repairs on turbines at schools
    - v. Identifying legislative champions
    - vi. Iowa Wind Energy Day will be held in Jan. to educate legislatures about wind
    - vii. Pursuing an addition to the RPS that asks from 1% wind generation by 2020
  - MA Renew, Francis Pullaro
    - i. Wind siting reform
      - 1. Streamline attempts past 2 legislative sessions
      - 2. Strong support to govern at local level
    - ii. Noise testing by EPA
      - Potential noise testing rule making need to watch

  - ii. Advocate meeting DG and net-metering impacts
